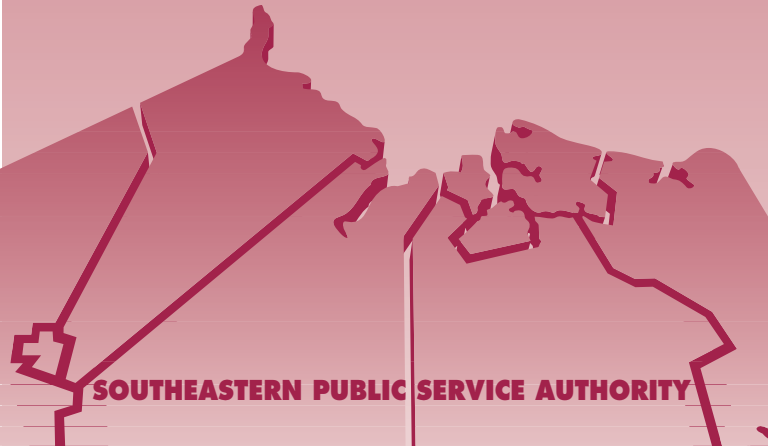

SPSA Residential Disposal Policy

Residents of SPSA's service area may receive free disposal of their household waste at any SPSA facility other than Oceana and Norfolk Transfer Stations only if the below conditions are met. Oceana Transfer Station does not accept residential waste. Norfolk Transfer Station has a separate policy.

1. All household waste, except furniture and appliances, must be contained in individual garbage bags which are tied shut. Furniture, mattresses, and appliances that have a freon certification sticker are acceptable.
2. Yard waste, which includes grass, leaves, etc., that is delivered to any SPSA transfer station, RDF Plant, or either landfill must be contained in clear plastic bags that are tied shut. Limbs, branches and brush need not be bagged, but must be less than six feet in length and not greater than 6 in diameter. Yard waste may be delivered unbagged only if it is taken directly to SPSA's Yard Waste Processing Facilities that are located at the Landfill II in Virginia Beach.
3. Solid waste must be delivered in one of the following private vehicles: Automobile, station wagon, van, sport utility vehicle, low sided, unmarked and unmodified pickup truck (1/2 ton or less). Utility trailer, less than eight feet in length being towed by one of the above mentioned vehicles that is not also transporting waste for disposal.

Waste delivered to a SPSA transfer station or the RDF Plant that does not meet the above conditions will be charged the prevailing disposal fee, with a minimum fee of \$15.00.

The following waste types are not eligible for free disposal at any SPSA transfer station or RDF Plant.

1. Household waste that is not bagged and tied shut.
2. Construction, demolition or remodeling waste materials, which includes roof shingles, as well as auto parts, machinery, and/or other waste materials that are too large to be completely bagged individually. Examples include, but are not limited to dirt, concrete, asphalt, lumber, paneling, vinyl, windows, doors, carpet, and engine blocks.
3. Mixed waste loads that contain materials that are acceptable and unacceptable for free disposal.
4. Waste delivered in pickups larger than 1/2 ton, commercial vehicles, rental trucks, vehicles licensed outside of SPSA's service area, or any vehicle deemed solely by SPSA's judgment to be used/or usable for commercial business are not allowed free disposal privileges.

Residents are allowed a total of twelve (12) free disposals per calendar year at the Regional Landfill in Suffolk for household waste from their personal residences. Residents must use a private vehicle as defined above and may dispose of all the waste types described above (free and charged). Virginia Beach residents may use either landfill.

SPSA's Residential Waste Policy is designed to ensure that the residents of SPSA's service area continue to receive safe and efficient disposal opportunities. Residents must adhere to all SPSA policies and procedures while on SPSA property and failure to do so may result in loss of privileges to use SPSA's facilities. General SPSA Facility Instructions:

- ¥ All vehicles must stop at facility scalehouse for directions, speed, traffic control signs, and traffic spotters must be obeyed. Children under 12 years old must remain in vehicle.
- ¥ Unless prior credit has been established, payment must be made by check or cash. Credit applications may be obtained from scale attendants or by calling (757) 420-4700.
- ¥ Cash customers will be required to pay a deposit at the inbound scale before dumping their waste. The required deposit amount will be \$30 for small vehicles and \$50 for large vehicles. The total charge will then be determined at the outbound scale.
- ¥ For holiday hours and directions to facilities or user instructions on the most appropriate facility for your waste disposal needs as well as directions to the facility closest to you, call SPSA's 24-hour automated information line at 424-4297.

User Instructions for Free Disposal of Certain Residential Recyclables and Other Special Wastes:

- ¥ Appliances with the freon removed and which contain a freon certification sticker will be accepted from residents free-of-charge.
- ¥ Up to five gallons of waste oil is accepted free-of-charge from residents per trip to SPSA's facilities.
- ¥ Up to four automobile or light truck tires with or without the rims are accepted free-of-charge from residents only.
- ¥ Auto, truck, boat, and other vehicular batteries are accepted at HHW facilities only by residents, for free disposal but should not be mixed with other waste.
- ¥ Household batteries including alkaline/zinc-carbon, 6 & 12 volt lead acid, rechargeable (Ni-Cd, Ni-MH, Li-ion), and button batteries are accepted free-of-charge from area residents in SPSA's household hazardous waste collection facilities. Also accepted are rechargeable batteries from computers and portable power tools.

List of Acceptable Recyclables

- ¥ SPSA's 18 gallon bin curbside program accepts the following items: newspaper, aluminum cans, pie plates and foil; clear, brown and green glass; #1 and #2 plastic bottles and steel food cans.
- ¥ SPSA's 95 gallon bin curbside program accepts the following items: newspaper, unwanted mail, magazines, catalogs, cardboard boxes; aluminum cans, pie plates and foil; clear, brown and green glass, plastic bottles and steel food cans.
- ¥ SPSA's business recycling program accepts all office paper.

Acceptable Waste at SPSA Facilities:

All household, municipal and commercial solid waste meeting SPSA standards is acceptable for disposal at SPSA facilities.

Unacceptable Waste at Any SPSA Facility:

- ¥ Free liquids
- ¥ Unstabilized sewage or dioxins sludge(s)
- ¥ Pesticide containers
- ¥ Drums
- ¥ Contaminated soil
- ¥ Infectious medical waste
- ¥ Large animal carcasses
- ¥ Slaughterhouse waste
- ¥ Unapproved industrial process waste
- ¥ Cable, wire, rope, etc. exceeding six feet in length
- ¥ Regulated hazardous waste
- ¥ Rigid items
- ¥ Materials containing friable asbestos
- ¥ Waste materials containing more than 50 ppm PCBs
- ¥ Waste, residues, or soils containing more than 1.0 part per billion of dioxins
- ¥ Any materials that fail a TCLP

General Rate Explanation

The \$10 rate would be appropriate for dry ADC of screened quality with the \$15 rate applying to material with manageable amounts of football sized debris. The \$20 rate would be applicable to material which requires SPSA to remove larger pieces of debris prior to its' beneficial reuse. All materials must be gradable (sufficiently dry) and have the same basic characteristics and appearance of clean fill before SPSA will consider using the material as cover.
