

SPSA'S RESIDENTIAL WASTE DISPOSAL GUIDELINES

FOR THE CHESAPEAKE, FRANKLIN, ISLE OF WIGHT, AND LANDSTOWN TRANSFER STATIONS, THE SUFFOLK TRANSFER STATION LOCATED AT THE REGIONAL LANDFILL.

1. Residents of SPSA's Service Area may receive free disposal of their household waste, limited to 12 visits per calendar year, at no charge, (see Note below), at the above referenced locations only if the following conditions are met.
 - a. Proof of residency within the SPSA Service Area. (For example a Driver's license or a utility bill).
 - b. All household waste, bagged or un-bagged, including furniture, mattresses and small appliances that have a freon-free certification sticker (if applicable) are acceptable.
 - c. Yard waste, which includes grass, leaves, etc., may be delivered to the above reference locations. However limbs, branches and brush must be less than six feet in length and not greater than 6" in diameter.
 - d. Solid waste must be delivered in one of the following "*private vehicle or rented pick-up truck*":
 - i. Unmarked (with exception of rental marking) and unmodified [for example, but not limited to, having no business decals/markings or no equipment racks (such as pipe or ladder racks or similar modifications)] automobile, station wagon, passenger van with under 15 seats, sport utility vehicle, pickup truck (1 ton capacity or smaller) or similar vehicles.
 - ii. Utility trailer (owned or rented), *up to twelve feet in length*, with no visible tools and/or equipment which is being towed by one of the above-mentioned private vehicles.
 - e. Waste delivered to the above referenced locations that does not meet the above conditions will be charged the prevailing disposal fee, with a minimum fee of \$20.00.
2. The following waste types are not eligible for free disposal at the above referenced locations:
 - a. Waste delivered in a pickup truck (private vehicle or rented) larger than a 1 ton capacity, commercial vehicles, marked (with exception of rental markings) and modified vehicles or any vehicle deemed solely by SPSA's judgment to be used or usable for commercial business are not allowed free disposal privileges.
 - b. Waste from rental properties.
3. SPSA's Residential Waste Disposal Guidelines are designed to ensure that residents of the SPSA service area continue to receive safe and efficient disposal opportunities.
4. Residents must adhere to all SPSA guidelines, policies and procedures while on SPSA property. Failure to do so may result in loss of privileges to use SPSA's facilities.
5. Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) cannot be disposed of at the above reference locations except during approved times. Please check with the individual location before making a trip to be sure the waste can be accepted or check the SPSA website (www.spsa.com). HHW can be taken directly to the HHW Collection Facility at the regional landfill in Suffolk on Tuesday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at no charge to the resident.
6. Tires (no more than 4) should be delivered to the SPSA Regional Landfill Monday – Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to Noon.
7. SPSA does not accept any "commercial" hazardous waste material or regulated medical waste at any SPSA location.

NOTE: *The Norfolk Transfer Station has separate residential guidelines. No residential waste is accepted at the Oceana Transfer Station. The 12 visits per calendar year limit does not apply at the Franklin and Isle of Wight Transfer Stations.*
